and unexpected monsoon season, water seepage occurred in many locations causing fungus formation and it leads to health issues. At many places, the painting got peeled off. Hence, it was proposed to scrap the existing internal & external coating before applying antifungal (wherever required) paint and then the primer along with 2 coats of painting is proposed.

The FC in its 50th meeting, suggested to proceed the painting work in the phased manner. As an initial phase, it is proposed to paint the quarters for amount of Rs.1.5 crore and recommended by the B&WC. The Fund may be utilized over the spill over fund from Ministry, if available under OH 31 or from IRG.

The Finance committee discussed the matter and recommended to Board for approval as recommended by B&WC.

CONSTRUCTION OF UG SUMP, OVERHEAD TANK & ITEM NO. CYCLE PARKING SHED FOR 506 SEATED AMETHYST 52.6 BOYS HOSTEL- RS 7.08 CR.

The Ministry sanctioned to construct the 503 seated boys hostel for EWS students. The administrative approval for the construction of 506 seated boys hostel was accorded for a value of Rs. 41.2 Crore in Mar 2021. The work order is finalized at Rs.27 Crores after the tendering process with the balance of Rs. 14.2 crores. The Civil and Electrical work is under progress. It is proposed to inaugurate the building in the month of Aug-2023. It is the first building which is constructed for G+3 floors and an overhead tank in the terrace. In this, the Institute observed the following works are essential for completing the project:

Our institute is proposed to construct 300 seated Hostel under PM AJAY scheme with the estimates of Rs 28.00 Cr. The hostel can be accommodated with 70% of SC/ST students and remaining 30% can be filled with others. As per the guidelines of the scheme, the Higher Educational Institutions which are top 100 ranked as per the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) shall be eligible for funding. The FC noted the institute efforts to avail the funding under PM AJAY scheme.

ITEM NO PURCHASE OF CCTV AND DRONE CAMERA FOR CAMPUS 52.9 SECURITY

Our institute is sprawling across ~770 acres of green campus which houses 9000+ students and staffs. In order to improve the safety of campus common areas, departments, lab, roads, and to prevent and track the unauthorized entry/exit there is need for advanced Surveillance systems in vital areas/points. Accordingly, a campus survey is carried out and it was proposed to install the comprehensive surveillance systems at the cost of around Rs 188 lakhs under Ministry funding (OH 35)

The Finance committee reviewed the proposal and recommended to the Board for approval for the purchase of CCTV and drone camera under Capital fund (OH 35).
