GENERAL MATTERS

Shri. Bhaskar Bhat, Chairperson, Board of Governors welcomed the members to the meeting. He informed about his visit to the Institute for the Convocation-2020 and mentioned the visits to various facilities on campus.

Thereafter, the Registrar (i/c) - Secretary initiated the deliberations on the Agenda Items.

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ITEM NO. 1

CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 61st MEETING OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS HELD ON 29th SEPTEMBER 2020

The Minutes of the 60th Meeting of the BoG were circulated to the Members of the Board and one comment was received, which was not reflecting the decision of the Board of Governors. However, the concern raised by the member was well taken. The Board confirmed the Minutes.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON THE DECISIONS OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS OF THE BOG

The Action Taken Report of the previous meetings of the Board of Governors were discussed and noted with the following observations.

The search for a short term Financial Consultant should continue for preparing a 5-year perspective financial plan, to assist the committee formed by the Institute and to compute the cost of running each degree programme.

ITEM NO. 3

DIRECTOR'S REPORT ON THE MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS SINCE THE LAST MEETING OF THE BOG.

The Director gave a presentation on the following major achievements and developments that took place in the Institute since the last Meeting of the Board of Governors:

• The 16th Convocation of the Institute was conducted in a blended mode, due to the COVID imposed restrictions, where the 53rd Batch of students were graduated. Degrees were awarded to 1777 graduates, including 803 B Tech, 38 B. Arch, 489 M Tech, 17 M. Arch, 67 M. Sc., 85 MCA, 72 MBA, 33

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- MS and a record 173 PhDs. Mr. Azim Premji, Chairperson of Azim Premji Foundation and founder of Wipro was the Chief guest.
- Online theory classes being handled through MS teams & Webex, completed UG teaching on 27th November & Examinations to finish by 18th December. Will be completing first year PG teaching on 15th Dec 2020. Next Semester will start on 18th January 2020.
- First year B Tech/B Arch classes commenced on 3rd December, orientation programme was conducted during 3rd and 4th December 2020 through online mode.
- Full time PhD scholars (Hostellers and days scholars) have been brought back to the Institute in a phased manner by following SOPs in 3 phases (around 150).
- In spite of the Pandemic, research publications saw an improvement. As on date in Scopus, the publications stand at 1046 against 995 in 2019 and citations at 19887 against 16614. In WoS, publications were 724 and citations 13699, as on date.
- 6 Faculty were recognized in World's Top 2% Scientists by Stanford University
- 2 Ph. D Scholars received the Prime Ministers Research Fellowship establishing the Institute as part of the PMRF scheme.
- Research and consultancy project earnings are much less than projected, as the results of project proposal submissions are yet to be announced by funding agencies, due to the COVID Pandemic.
- Interaction sessions were conducted Cadre wise for Group B & C Non-Teaching staff (4 sessions) & for NMRs (2 sessions), to appraise about the progress Institute is making and to take feedback. Training of NMRs for Analytical ability, English etc. were conducted to help them in the forthcoming recruitment.
- 'IGNITTE' the teaching Club of the Institute, trained rural Govt. school students for competitive examinations and two





- students got into B Tech program at NIT Trichy and 2 more in Govt. Medical colleges.
- The Director also presented the broad outline of the Institute's alignment to the National Education Policy 2020 and sought the directions from the Board regarding introduction of online degree programs.
- Regarding the starting of online degree programmes, the Board suggested to have a purpose definition for this initiative by a suitable committee (Strategic Planning Group/ Academic Reforms Committee/PG Expert committee), so that the NIT Tiruchirappalli brand value is retained. As a pilot, a few PG courses can be considered for online degree programs. Inputs from Departments and Alumni can be obtained regarding the market and other details regarding such programmes.



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ITEM NO. 5

SANCTION OF ADDITIONAL TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING STAFF POSITIONS

The Board discussed in detail the proposal and approved in principle that it is very essential to have increased number of faculty and staff to build the future of the Institute and to achieve the goals of the Strategic Plan.

As per the current student strength of 6833, the requirement of teaching and non-teaching positions will be 569 and 626 respectively at a Faculty student ratio of 1: 12. (current sanction is 393 and 432, additional sanction of 176 Teaching and 194 Non-Teaching positions)

The Institute was advised to prepare an elaborate proposal, justifying the positions to the Ministry, at the earliest.

RESOLVED FURTHER THAT an elaborate proposal be prepared, justifying the additional positions and be submitted to the Ministry, at the earliest.



ITEM NO. 7

RECRUITMENT OF NON-TEACHING STAFF

The Board approved the advertisement of 101 Group B&C positions for Non-Teaching staff, out of the 230 vacant positions in the B & C Non-Teaching staff.

The 3 stage procedure of selection as proposed, with the terms and





conditions prescribed were approved. The Institute will engage a professional agency to conduct stage I- Screening test and stage III-Final written test for the selection. The Stage II - skill test, which is qualifying in nature, will be conducted by the Institute.

The regular staff of the Institute who are otherwise eligible, shall be allowed to participate in the selection process irrespective of age and percentage of marks. (Circular No. F.35-5/2018-TS.III dated 20th Feb 2019). Those employees who are working on adhoc/temporary/contractual/outsourced basis in REC/NITs may be given a one-time age relaxation (Up to 59 years as resolved earlier by BoG NIT Tiruchirappalli) to participate in the first regular recruitment process for the posts for which they fulfill all other conditions mentioned in the Recruitment rules 2019.

The 97 Non Muster Roll (NMR) employees currently working in the Institute will be encouraged to apply for positions for which they have the qualifications. All the 97 NMRs currently working in the Institute, in case not selected in the regular recruitment, will be retained, as reiterated in the Board meeting. Even after the advertisement for 101 positions, there are still 129 vacancies in B & C Non-Teaching cadre at the Institute and 97 NMRs will be retained.

PROPOSAL FOR 2 MWp ROOFTOP SOLAR PV SYSTEM ITEM NO.10 INSTALLATION FROM HOSTEL FUND The Board discussed the recommendations of the FC and the proposal in detail and looked at the merits in the installation of 2MWp rooftop solar PV System at a cost of Rs. 8.5 Crores from the interest accrued on the hostel mess deposits and caution deposit. The energy generated from the solar source will be used in the academic zone and in the hostels zone. The Board noted the advice of FC to the Institute to follow the purchase procedure as per GFR and tender may be called for, through GeM / E-Tender and if required, to hire a Consultant for efficient execution of the project. The Board advised the Board to explore the possibility of having a separate residential connection from the Electricity Board for the residential houses. 	In 2003, REC Tiruchirappalli was renamed as National Institute of

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Technology (NIT) and became the Institution of National Importance by the NIT Act 2007. The faculty and staff are governed by the recruitment rules issued by Ministry of Education (erstwhile MHRD), Government of India from time to time.

The model recruitment rule for NITs was released in 2012 and regarding restructuring of Non-Teaching staff positions at NIT Tiruchirappalli, as per Item No.3.2 of the 33rd Meeting of the BoG held on 29th March 2013, the promotions for non-teaching staff for the intermediate period between 2003 (transformation into NIT from REC) to 11.06.2012 (date of issue of model RR for Non-Teaching staff by MHRD) were initiated and Departmental Promotion Committees (DPCs) were conducted in April 2013 and eligible non-teaching staff members (39 persons) were promoted, as per the available vacancy, the requisite qualification and experience. DPC was again conducted in October 2014 and eligible non-teaching staffs were promoted (9 persons). Hence, appropriate action has been taken to map and promote the non-teaching staff of REC who were migrated to the NIT system.

MACP (Modified Assured Career Promotion Scheme) was given to eligible non-teaching staff in August 2016 (5 persons). Subsequently, DPC and MACP were conducted in March 2017 and eligible staff were promoted as per the Recruitment Rule 2014 (RR2014) of the Ministry (26 persons under DPC and 2 under MACP).

As per the request of the non-teaching staff to address the anomalies in the RR 2014 and as per the resolution in the 46th meeting of the Board of Governors, the Institute constituted a Grievance Redressal Committee(I) in July 2017. Later, MHRD had issued the revised Recruitment rules (RR2017) on 20th December 2017. In March 2018, as per RR2017, MACP was granted to eligible non-teaching staff (8 persons).

The Grievance Redressal Committee (I) which submitted its recommendations in March 2018 had suggested that

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implementation of the RR 2017 would resolve most of the anomalies/grievances of the non-teaching staff of NIT Tiruchirappalli. Out of the 29 consolidated grievances submitted to the committee, 17 were not considered by the committee, 12 were recommended.

Further, MHRD had issued new Recruitment Rules 2019 on 20th February 2019 with a clarification on 4th April 2019 (RR2019). The Institute after due approval of the new Recruitment Rules 2019 by the Board of Governors, did extensive mapping and through DPC and MACP, promoted the eligible non-teaching staff as per RR2019, in May 2019, including implementation of 7 recommendations by the Grievance Redressal committee (I) (61 persons under DPC and 13 under MACP). Five grievances, related to more promotional avenues for supporting staff and re-designation of positions are not feasible as per RR 2019.

Since there were some representations from the non-teaching staff after the mapping and DPC in May 2019, another Grievance Redressal Committee (II) was constituted by the Institute which went through all the representations from the Technical and Ministerial staff, and submitted the report in February 2020. The recommendations of this Grievance Redressal Committee (II) has been taken care of and subsequently in September 2020, eligible staff members were promoted under DPC (18 persons).

Hence the grievances of the Non-Teaching Staff have been adequately addressed by the Institute from time to time.
