RECRUITMENT FOR NON-TEACHING VACANT POSITIONS

With respect to recruitment proposal submitted to the 69th Board, the certain clarification was raised by the BoG members. The sanctioned details were cross-verified with MHRD order no F.19-13/2008 – TS.III dated 11.06.2012. The number of non-faculty posts proposed for advertisement at Group A, B& C positions were found to be in order. The clarifications with respect to Technical Officer cadre, Executive Engineer cadre and reservation details were discussed.

RESOLVED THAT the board noted the reservation roster and advertisement for filling up of vacancies as per board resolution no. 69/BoG/2022/6 be released except Technical Officer post.

RESOLVED FURTHER THAT the institute will maintain two posts of Executive Engineer in the GP 5400. The incumbent Executive Engineer will continue in the Grade Pay of Rs. 6,600.

ITEM NO. 70.6

NON-MUSTER ROLL EMPLOYEES AT NIT, TIRUCHIRAPPALLI

In the year 2003, RECs which were under the administrative control of state governments were converted to NITs and brought under the control of central government. During the transition from REC to NITs

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appropriate decision would have been taken on the status of NMR employees who were employed on temporary basis by REC administration. By following the practice of regularizing the NMR employees after serving atleast for five years only a section of NMR employees were inducted in the NIT system others were left out. They need to be given relaxation in the present form of recruitment to bring them into NIT system.

The BoG of NIT, Tiruchirappalli (NITT) in its 25th Meeting, resolved that fifty percent of the vacancies to be filled within the Institutes serving NMRs based on seniority and qualification by issuing an internal announcement. After screening of their applications and interview, they will be issued with necessary office order for their appointment in NIT-T. The Remaining fifty percent of the vacancies for which advertisement has to be released and the remaining NMRs will also compete in the selection process. However, the same was not implemented in the subsequent years.

Presently, NMRs are employed at NIT, Tiruchirappalli and they in general, they have been doing their work in various areas such as clerical, technical, driving, Estate Maintenance, Security guards for nearly 20 years to 27 long years of skillset in the respective domains. Considering the years of experience, they were categorized as highly skilled category for wages as per the notification of Chief Labour commissioner, Ministry of Labour and Employment.

To address the above problem, it is proposed to create provision to allow NMRs to appear for skill test and to recruit them by waiving of written test. They may be allowed to go through the regular recruitment process with relaxing the age limit condition and based only on skill test as process of selection.

The institute vide BoG resolution no. 61/BoG/2020/7, follows three stage selection process for recruitment to the Ministerial and Technical positions in Group(B&C) cadres as below:

- i) Screening test (only for shortlisting of applicants)
- ii) Skill Test (Qualifying in nature)
- iii) Main Written Test

The final selection will be on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in the main written test.

EXTRA-ORDINARY LEAVE REQUEST OF DR. R PRIYANKA, MEDICAL OFFICER

Dr. (Mrs.) R Priyanka, Medical Officer, Staff No. 2217 is working from 13/09/2017 in this Institute and she had completed probation period of 2 years satisfactorily on 12/09/2019. She has requested for permission to attend NEET PG Counselling 2022 to pursue and join 3 years MD (Doctor of Medicine), full time Post Graduate Course through NEET PG Counselling 2022.

As per the Clause 35 of First Statues of NITs – "The leave for all the employees of the Institute shall be governed by the CCS (Leave) Rules, 1972.". However, NIT Tiruchirappalli has revised its leave rules in accordance with the CCS (Leave) Rules, 1972 and as per the 53rd BoG Resolution No.53/BoG/2019/12 adopted the same in the Institute.

NITT Leave rules does not have special provision for study leave, however, as per 3.8.4 and 3.8.6 of NIIT Leave rules, EOL for the purpose. The points are reproduced as below:

- 1) After completing 3 years of continuous service in the Institute an employee can avail 24 months extra Ordinary Leave for the purpose of pursuing studies certified to be in the public interest (leading to award of degree).
- 2) Extra ordinary leave may be granted for the purpose of availing research fellowships or for pursuing higher studies leading to the award of a degree from Institution in India/abroad. Such requests forward through the HOD to the Director. Director is authorized to sanction Extra Ordinary Leave up to six months period; beyond, the Board approval is required.

As per NIT Statues, clause 17.9, the Director shall have the-power to send members of the staff for training or to attend course of instruction inside India subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified by

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the ordinances.

Hence, she was granted Extraordinary Leave for higher studies without pay for the period of six months w.e.f 27/10/2022. She had submitted a bond for Extraordinary Leave to serve the institute for three years after rejoining as per clause 3.8.11 of NITT Leave rules. However, in the event of failure to serve the Institute for a period of three years for any reasons (resign/discontinuation etc.) after availing EOL for the abovementioned period and purpose, she shall forthwith pay to the NITT on demand an amount equivalent to the salary for the period of months for which Extra Ordinary Leave (EOL) has been granted.

As Board approval is required for EOL beyond six months, approval may be given to Dr. (Mrs.) R Priyanka for availing EOL for further period of 2 years and six months on EOL without pay.

ITEM PAINTING FOR QUARTERS- RS 1.50CR

NO. 70.8

The total number of quarters at present is 613 nos and only 580 nos of quarters are in livable condition. Due to continuous rain and unexpected monsoon season, water seepage occurred in many locations causing fungus formation and it leads to health issues. At many places, the painting got peeled off. Hence, it was proposed to scrap the existing Internal & external coating before applying antifungal (wherever required) paint and then the primer along with 2 coats of painting is proposed.

The FC in its 50th meeting, suggested to proceed the painting work in the phased manner. As an initial phase, it is proposed to paint the quarters for amount of Rs.1.5 crore and recommended by the B&WC. The

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Fund may be utilized over the spill over fund from Ministry, if available under OH 31 or from IRG.

ADDITIONAL APPROVAL- FOR SUPPLY, INSTALLATION, TESTING, AND COMMISSIONING OF "NEW SUBSTATION NEAR OJAS AT NIT CAMPUS" - RS 0.52 CR

The proposal for the New substation with capacity of 1 x 500 KVA near OJAS building was approved in 27th and 36th FC with the project cost of Rs 1.20 Crore. Since the OJAS building housing, the various labs equipped with high precision equipment which requires un-interrupted power supply. Accordingly, the B&WC has recommended for 1 x 1000kVA transformer near Golden Jubilee hall instead of providing 1 x 500kVA transformer near OJAS. The total estimated cost for 1 x 1000 kVA transformer is Rs 1.72 Crores. The B&WC has recommended the above proposal with the additional cost of Rs 0.52 Crore for the proposed work under OH 35 funding.

The Finance committee discussed the above proposal and recommended the additional project cost of 0.52 Cr to Board for approval.

The Ministry sanctioned to construct the 503 seated boys hostel for EWS students. The administrative approval for the construction of 506 seated boys hostel was accorded for a value of Rs. 41.2 Crore in Mar 2021. The work order is finalized at Rs.27 Crores after the tendering process with the balance of Rs. 14.2 crores. The Civil and Electrical work is under progress. It is proposed to inaugurate the building in the month of Aug-2023. It is the first building which is constructed for G+3 floors and an overhead tank in the terrace.
